Member of the Week - Hodag Sno-Trails

Hodag Sno-Trails is a 501(c)(3), charitable, not-for-profit, volunteer organization, and remains Rhinelander's original snowmobile organization. Hodag Sno-Trails are one of the 9 snowmobile clubs in the County. There are over 25,000 miles of trails in the State, and of that- 75% crosses private property. We have built and continue to maintain over 140 miles of scenic, adventurous trails for public use and enjoyment. The goal of the club is responsibility for maintaining and grooming trails. This involves obtaining landowner approvals, clearing obstacles, marking trails, and using grooming equipment to create a smooth and safe riding experience. The club continues to work on expanding the network of snowmobile trails, which could involve negotiating with landowners, obtaining necessary permits, and securing funding for trail development. With a primary focus on promoting public use and enjoyment, we are also involved in promoting safe riding practices which include organizing safety courses, distributing informational materials, and encouraging adherence to local regulations (stay on the trails!).



Think Snow!

Fund-raising events play a crucial role in raising funds for our club. Wisconsin's snowmobiling program is self-funded (snowmobile registrations and trail passes). Only 2/3 of Hodag Sno-Trails fall under the category of "funded" trails, the rest of the trails are listed as "club" trails and are the financial responsibility of Hodag Sno-Trails to maintain. One of the club's largest fundraising events is our annual Ice Golf Tournament and Meat Raffle - which will be held on March 23, 2024, at Fishers Resort Bar and Grill on Lake George.

This season in 2024, Hodag Sno-Trails celebrates 50 years of dedicated efforts, and countless hours of perfecting the trails that have become the backbone of our snowmobiling legacy. Through dedication and passion, we've crafted a network of trails that not only provides exhilarating rides for snowmobile enthusiasts, but also contributes significantly to the local economy. Join us in celebrating our 50th anniversary as we continue to groom the paths that connect the heart of Wisconsin's snowmobiling experiences.

As a reminder....

The primary focus will be on the brushing / marking of the trail reroute by Camp Tesomas.
